Eagle Scout Project

Recently Rivertree Church church bought some property on which to build a campus. The property had two barns and a house already built on it, and the church began to use the house as an office. However, the house had wood siding that was deteriorating and in need of replacement. In addition, the church had begun an expansion on the back of the house to serve as a youth annex. The construction plan called for installing hardiplank siding on the new annex portion as well as the existing portion. This required that the old siding and insulation be removed along with the existing windows.

For Austin’s project, he organized a group of workers comprised of fellow scouts and students in the church youth group to do the job. This involved removal of the existing siding, insulation, and windows on the front and back of the house, followed by the installation of new insulation, windows, moisture barrier, and siding. In addition to the construction work, Austin sold Dominos pizza cards to raise money so as to offset some of the construction materials cost. The work encompassed three consecutive Saturdays in August, 2009. During that timeframe, over 40 people helped complete the task totaling over 325 volunteer hours. Thanks to their contributions, the youth group now enjoys a new facility to hold Bible studies, youth events, and various church activities.
